 - Submissions for our awards honouring a single individual are to be submitted in two sections. Section A, which is a 250 word summary, is due on **November 30, 2015**. The summaries will then be reviewed by the selection committees and a shortlist of top contenders will be formed. Those shortlisted will be asked to complete **Section B** of the nomination template. **Section B** of the template is due **February 1, 2016**.
 - Submissions for team and organizational awards are due on **February 1, 2016**.
- **SUBMIT** your application via e-mail by the date indicated on the nomination form and template to cmacbride@cchl-ccls.ca.

Shortlisted nominations received for the 2016 competition will be featured in the College’s *Celebrating Leading Practices* booklet. This booklet will be available for free download from the College’s website.

Join us on Sunday, June 5, 2016 as we recognize the College's National Awards Program recipients and celebrate their achievements.

The College is pleased to host two separate award celebrations; our Annual General Meeting will be held on Sunday afternoon on June 5, 2016. During this ceremony we will recognize the Chapter Awards for Distinguished Service.

On Sunday evening, June 5, 2016, the College will host the Honouring Health Leadership awards event (formerly known as the National Awards Gala). This is a black tie optional event. Honoured at the event will be the following awards: the Award of Excellence in Mental Health and Quality Improvement; the College Award for Distinguished Service; the College Honorary Life Member Award; the Energy and Environmental Stewardship Award; the Excellence in Diversity and Inclusion Award; the Healthcare Safety Award; the Innovation Award for Healthcare Leadership; the Mentorship Award; the Nursing Leadership Award; the President's Award for Outstanding Corporate Membership in the College; Celebrating the Human Spirit Award; and the Robert Zed Young Health Leader Award.

Award winning projects and individuals will be showcased at the National Health Leadership Conference at the Awards' Corner. Award recipients will receive paid travel and accommodations to attend the College's awards event on June 5, 2016, and a complimentary registration to the National Health Leadership Conference, June 6-7, 2016. All events are being held in Ottawa, Ontario.

In keeping with tradition, the Robert Wood Johnson Awards and the 3M Health Care Quality Team Awards will be presented at the National Health Leadership Conference, on June 6 and 7, respectively.

3M Health Care Quality Team Awards

The Award

3M Health Care encourages institutions and healthcare providers to embrace quality management by developing innovative approaches that bring about sustainable improvement. This award recognizes four important elements: innovation; quality; patient/family engagement; and teamwork, and provides Canadian health leaders with an excellent opportunity to recognize team members who have applied the quality process to create measurable benefits in their network of services and programs.

The winning team in each category will receive a certificate of recognition, a cash prize of \$7,500, a travel subsidy of up to \$6,000 for six team members to attend the awards ceremony, which will be held during the National Health Leadership Conference, and a \$1,000 allowance will be made available for local celebrations. Both the College and 3M Health Care will provide the winning teams with communication support for the awards.

Eligibility

Awards will be given in two categories: quality improvement initiative(s) within an organization; and quality improvement initiative(s) across a health system. Administrative and operational teams including interdisciplinary teams, cross-functional teams across all sectors of healthcare are eligible to apply. A team must consist of a minimum of three people.

Nominations

Nominations must be submitted by **February 1, 2016**. Results-oriented projects that have created a significant, sustained change within an organization will be considered. Teams may submit one or several quality improvement projects. The project should have been implemented within the past three years and show evidence of sustainability over a minimum of 18 months. Teams may self nominate.

To submit a nomination, please download the full criteria, nomination form and template from www.cchl-ccls.ca. The nomination package should include the following:

- a completed nomination form;
- using the template, please include an executive summary highlighting the reasons why the team should be considered for the award (the summary statement must be signed by the chief executive officer); a written report; and a brief description of the project, including the name of a contact person, mailing address, e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers for publication.

Award of Excellence in Mental Health and Quality Improvement

The Award

This award honours a hospital, health authority, community based mental health and addictions program/service, or a leader in the field that demonstrates evidence-informed and sustained quality improvements (QI) in the area of mental health and addictions.

The recipient will receive an etched glass trophy, paid travel and accommodations for one individual to attend the College's Honouring Health Leadership event and a complimentary registration to the National Health Leadership Conference. In addition, the recipient will receive a \$7,500 grant for the organization to use to continue their QI activities in their mental health program and \$1,000 for an educational leadership event and translation of best practices within the winning organization.

Eligibility

This award is open to individuals and organizations that demonstrate: (a) recent (two years) application of evidence-based quality improvements in their health system which improves outcomes for patients with mental illness and/or addictions (b) sustained system/program improvements. Possible nominees could include, but are not limited to:

- a hospital based mental health program providing a continuum of services;
- a community-based mental health and addictions program that is publically funded and has official partnerships with hospitals as part of the continuum of care for the treatment of mental health and addictions;
- a school based program that supported mental health for children/youth;
- a corrections-based mental health and addictions program; and
- a recognized health systems leader in the field of mental health and addictions.

Nominations

Nominations must be made by a member of the College and be submitted by **February 1, 2016**. To submit a nomination, download the nomination form and template from www.cchl-ccls.ca. Nominations must be submitted as one PDF file and include the following:

- the completed nomination form;
- a letter of nomination from a member of the College;
- The completed template, describing the QI initiative undertaken, including the results; and
- letters of support from three sources clearly articulating how the nominee meets the criteria for this award.

The Award

This can be interpreted broadly to include any act that improves an individual patient's health and/or spirit, the lives of the patient's family and/or the community. This award is a vehicle to share their stories with colleagues from across Canada and to help inspire others. The winner will receive an etched glass trophy, paid travel and accommodations to attend the College's Honouring Health Leadership event and a complimentary registration to the National Health Leadership Conference.

Eligibility

This award is open to all Canadian healthcare professionals, leaders, teams and volunteers who have had a marked impact on patients, their family or the community. This award is open to College members and non-members alike. Programs, stand-alone acts and special initiatives from across the continuum of care are eligible for consideration.

Nominations

Nominations must be made by a member of the College. We are asking nominators to submit their nomination in two sections. **Section A**, which is to be submitted by **November 30, 2015**, is a 250 word summary. The summary should touch on the eligibility criteria and illustrate why you feel that the nominee should win this award. The summaries will be reviewed by the selection committee and a short list of top contenders will be formed. Those on the shortlist will be asked to complete **Section B** of the nomination, due **February 1, 2016**.

Chapter Awards for Distinguished Service

The Award

This award provides an opportunity for chapters to recognize an individual or corporate member who has made a significant contribution to their chapter. The recipient will be recognized at a major chapter meeting and will be mentioned at the College's Annual General Meeting.

Eligibility

Nominees for this award must be members of the College with a minimum of three years of consecutive membership in the College. In addition, nominees must have, within the past three years, participated in College activities and demonstrated leadership in educational programming, member recruitment or other areas of voluntary contribution, not necessarily confined to the chapter level, but within their respective province.

Nominations

Nominations must be made by a College member, preferably within the same province or chapter as the nominee.

Nominations are to be submitted to the nominee's chapter's executive committee. The winners will be chosen by the chapter's executive committee.

The nomination package should include the following:

- the completed nomination form;
- a letter of nomination; and

To fulfill the eligibility criteria members must:

- have served in leadership roles in a health organization at the international, national and/or provincial/territorial level;
- have made a major contribution to the Canadian College of Health Leaders by having served on the College's Board of Directors, on an executive committee of a College chapter, or by the active and public promotion of the College's mission, vision and values;
- have been acknowledged as having served as mentor to a number of health leaders who were/are in the earlier phases of their professional careers;
- be a retired member of the College, who continues to promote health service excellence; and
- be acknowledged as being worthy of a College's Honorary Life Member Award for their outstanding contribution as a leader in health services.

Energy and Environmental Stewardship Award

The Award

This award recognizes a progressive healthcare organization that has implemented organizational wide initiatives demonstrating environmental responsibility through the reduction of energy usage, the preservation of natural resources and effective waste diversion solutions. Possible initiatives include the implementation of energy efficient building systems and solutions, comprehensive energy and environmental awareness programs, waste management initiatives, and green procurement practices.

The winner will receive an etched glass trophy, a framed certificate of recognition, paid travel and accommodations for one individual to attend the College's Honouring Health Leadership event and a complimentary registration to attend the National Health Leadership Conference. In addition, the winner will receive \$2,000 cash prize to be directed to the organization's foundation or charity of choice.

Eligibility

All Canadian health care organizations are eligible for this award, regardless of size. However, the following criteria must be satisfied:

- demonstrate steps taken to ensure sustainability of environmental initiatives;
- show evidence of results achieved through the implementation of environmental initiatives;
- illustrate initiatives taken to engage staff and the community;
- explain how these initiatives have resulted in an improvement in the overall environment; and
- provide evidence that these initiatives are in line with the corporate business plan endorsed by the senior management team.

Nominations

Nominations must be made by a member of the College and be submitted by **February 1, 2016**. To submit a nomination, please download the nomination form and template from www.cchl-ccls.ca. The nomination package should include the following:

- a completed nomination form;
- a letter of support from the chief executive officer or designate, who is a member of the College; and
- using the template, describe the energy and environmental stewardship program undertaken, including results. Describe any additional benefits achieved by the facility as a result of the program.

Healthcare Safety Award

The Award

Innovation Award for Healthcare Leadership

The Award

This award recognizes the outstanding capabilities and achievements of a senior executive who, through a career of service, has made significant contributions to the profession by pushing the envelope and providing leadership that is sound, steady, strategic and effective and has fundamentally influenced the culture of the organization. - Achieved tangible, sustainable results from the focused attention and investment in innovation that would be in the category of game changing or breakthrough innovation (vs. incremental change) that has had a direct impact on patient care. Specific examples of which are to be referenced in the nomination (include success metrics).

Mentorship Award

The Award

The Mentorship Award is presented to a leader in the healthcare system who demonstrates exemplary, sustained commitment to mentoring, and inspiring healthcare leadership. The winner will receive an etched glass trophy, paid travel and accommodations to attend the College's Honouring Health Leadership event and a complimentary registration to the National Health Leadership Conference. In addition, the winner will receive a \$2,500 cash prize to be directed to the recipient's health system foundation of choice, to support education and/or leadership initiatives.

Mentorship is a one-on-one relationship in which one person (the mentor) helps develop another (the mentee or protégé) by sharing wisdom, insight and skills, and creating valuable and multifaceted access to organizational dynamics and processes.¹ The mentor may or may not be employed in the same organization as the protégé or be in the protégé's chain of command or profession.²

Eligibility

The nominee must be a member of the College. The successful nominee will be viewed by the profession as a recognized leader who, through dedicated service, has made a substantial contribution to health care mentorship within their own organization and/or within the health system. To be considered for this award, the nominee will have demonstrated mentorship skills in the following areas:

- providing constructive feedback in a professional manner;
- assisting in building social networking connections within their own organization and/or within the health system;
- serving as a role model and leader;
- providing advice with respect to professional development; and
- creating a positive, trusting relationship amongst professionals to foster personal and professional growth.

As a testament to their commitment to mentorship, the nominee will have directly or indirectly mentored numerous healthcare leaders, leaving a recognized legacy of inspired leadership. The mentor must

also demonstrate an on-going commitment to fostering their own professional development.

The Robert Wood Johnson Awards

The Award

The Robert Wood Johnson Award, established in 1956 by Johnson & Johnson, is exclusively for students. The Award

The Robert Zed Young Health Leader Award is presented to a Canadian healthcare leader who has demonstrated leadership in improving the effectiveness and sustainability of Canada's health system. The winner will receive an etched glass trophy, paid travel and accommodations to attend the College's Honouring Health Leadership event and a complimentary registration to the National Health Leadership Conference.

Eligibility

Nominations are invited for leaders, age 40 or younger and must satisfy the following criteria:

- be a member of the College;
- has, in the last 5-10 years, shown leadership growth and advancement in their healthcare career, and demonstrates potential for senior healthcare leadership positions in the future, in any area of health services, including public health, health prevention, health promotion, acute care, long term care, rehabilitation, mental health and drug dependency services, national, provincial or local health organizations, health charities, private sector health organizations or any related area; and
- has demonstrated outstanding vision and leadership through a project, program, publication, community involvement, philanthropy, or other activity that has resulted in measurable improvements within their organization and/or within the health system.

Nominations

Nominations must be made by a College member. Nominators are to submit their nomination in two sections. **Section A** of the nomination, which is a 250 word summary, is to be submitted by **November 30, 2015**. The summaries will be reviewed by the selection committee and a shortlist of top contenders will be formed. Those shortlisted will be asked to complete **Section B** of the nomination, which is due on **February 1, 2016**.
