

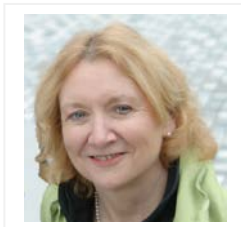

Dianne Doyle, President and CEO of Providence Health Care

Dianne Doyle was appointed in 2006 as President and Chief Executive Officer of Providence Health Care, bringing more than 20 years of senior executive experience in health care and over 25 years directly at Providence Health Care. Her previous roles included Head Nurse and Medical Instructor at St. Paul’s Hospital, Vice President Patient Care Services and later Chief Operating Officer and Vice President, Patient Care and Support Services for Mount Saint Joseph’s Hospital. Dianne is recognized as a champion of Catholic health care provincially and nationally. She is the immediate past Chair of the Catholic Health Association of Canada, Vice Chair of the Catholic Health Association of BC and Chair of the Denominational Health Association of BC. Dianne was also the inaugural Chair of the BC Health Care Leaders Association, subsequently serving as a board member for several years. She is currently a fellow of the Canadian College of Health Services Executives (CCHSE); member of the Royal Roads University Centre for Health Leadership and Research Advisory Board and the Association of Canadian Academic Healthcare Organizations Board; Chair of the Board of Canadian Advanced Medical Services International (CAMSI); and past member of the Canadian Health Services Research Foundation (CHSRF) EXTRA Advisory Council. Her health leadership credentials include a CHA in Health Services Management, a CHE Certification from CCHSE, and Fellowship in CCHSE. In 2007 and 2008, the Toronto-based Women’s Executive Network named Dianne as one of Canada’s Top 100 Most Powerful Women in the Public Sector.

Dr. Robert Halpenny, President and CEO of Interior Health Authority

Dr. Halpenny was appointed as President & Chief Executive Office for Interior Health on January 15, 2010. He joined Interior Health in January 2007 as the Senior Medical Director responsible for coordinating and directing medical staff and providing leadership for the medical directors and clinical issues throughout Interior Health.

Dr. Halpenny completed his Family Practice Residency in 1982 after spending numerous clinical rotations in Kelowna and then setting up a practice in Vancouver. As the Vice President of Medicine at St. Vincent's, he completed his Master's Degree in Health Administration from the University of Colorado and then spent six years in Grand Junction, Colorado as the Vice President of

Medicine at St. Mary's Hospital. He returned to BC in 2002 as the Vice President of Medicine for Fraser Health and then accepted the position of Provincial Executive Director Cardiac Services at Provincial Health Services Authority (PHSA).

Dr. Halpenny presently sits on the BC Medical Services Commission, the Board of the Canadian Agency for Drugs and Technologies in Health, and on the Management Board of Health Shared Services of BC. He remains active playing hockey, golf and skiing.

Dr. Nigel Murray, President and CEO of Fraser Health Authority

Areas of Responsibility: The overall management and delivery of health programs and services in one of the largest health regions in Canada, overseeing acute care hospitals as well as community-based residential, home health, mental health and public health services. Fraser Health serves 1.5 million people from Burnaby to White Rock to Boston Bar, with an annual budget of \$1.8 billion and employing 22,000 people.

Career Snapshot: Dr. Murray was previously the Interim CEO of the Southland District Health Board and the Lead CEO for New Zealand Health Sector Industrial and Employee Relations. Before that, he worked in senior health administration roles including Acting General Manager, National Women's Hospital; General Manager, Planning and Development, Auckland District Health Board; and General Manager, Health Services Delivery Plan. In 1995, he was named a Member of the Order of the British Empire for services to health in the New Zealand Defence Force.

Formal Education: Bachelor of Arts, Dartmouth College; Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery, University of Otago Medical School; Masters of Occupational Medicine, Harvard University School of Public Health.

Howard Waldner, President and CEO of Vancouver Island Health Authority

Howard Waldner joined the Vancouver Island Health Authority as President and Chief Executive Officer in October 2004.

Prior to this appointment, Howard was the former Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the Calgary Health Region - a post he held for five years.

Preceding the move to Canada in 1999, Howard held several Chief Executive Officer and Senior Executive positions within the National Health Service in the United Kingdom.

Howard received his MBA from the University of Glasgow, Scotland and is an active member of the Canadian College of Health Leaders. He is also a Fellow of the UK Institute of Health Care Management and an Adjunct Professor with the Faculty of Medicine at the University of British Columbia.
