This role will be central to Sunnybrook's and the NT-OHT's goal to enhance population health for North Toronto residents. The Vice President will work with partners and stakeholders to strategically align community integration and collaborative planning and partnerships; develop and strengthen partnerships with North Toronto primary care groups and specialist care networks; and support ongoing home care modernization efforts in the broader health care system.

As the ideal candidate, you have extensive health sector leadership experience, ideally in home, community care, and / or long-term care with experience in the delivery of primary and community support services. You are a systems thinker

who is as comfortable working directly with community partners as you are developing strategies and leading change. You are a respected and collaborative people leader who excels at managing, enabling, and mentoring teams. You are dedicated to advancing health equity and building inclusive workplaces. You are comfortable driving and enabling transformative change at multiple levels of an organization and health system. You have a deep understanding of Ontario's current health system transformation and at minimum a Master's degree in health sciences, administration or a related field.
